
Global Inflation




Curve Analysis




Current Yield Curve



Change In Effective Fed Funds




Highest Rates in 22 Years


Fed Funds Futures Projection Of Rate Hikes





Regulatory Environment

- American Bank Regulations tend to fight yesterday's problem.
- Expect new regulations for Bank's \$100bln and higher.
- But the new regulations tend to trickle down to smaller banks.
- Robust banking lobby in the U.S. means a tough fight for new regulations to be voted in.
- Merger's & Acquisitions are beginning to pick back up.
- M&A is the preferred method of American regulators to solve problem banks.
- All of this leads us to a tougher regulatory environment and more pressure on risk managers.



TOOLS TO MONITOR RISK IN A HIGHLY VOLATILE INTEREST RATE ENVIRONMENT

Different Type of Crisis

- Great Financial Crisis of 2008 was a credit crisis.
- 2022-2023 is a duration/interest rate risk crisis.
- The banking system was forced to accept \$5tln of Covid era monetary/fiscal stimulus.
- Regulators/Investors encouraged banks to buy securities at record low rates.
- Purchase safe (from a credit aspect) securities and earn an attractive spread over a zero cost of funds.
- The idea of a 550bps rate hike in 18 months wasn't on anyone's mind. Credit quality remained high.
- An immediate repricing on the liability side while deposits were shrinking, paired with long duration assets at a loss left us in the position we are in today.
